Pastor's Message



The Lenten Season is half over. "Lent" comes from the old English word for spring-time, perhaps connected to the lengthening of daylight hours. Christians understand Lent as the forty days before Easter, beginning with Ash Wednesday and mirroring the forty days and nights Jesus spent in the wilderness, fasting and being tested by the Diabolical One, Satan. Like Advent, Lent invites us to the discipline of self-examination, repentance, and remembrance. The psalmist invites God to search him and know his thoughts and his hearts (Ps. 139: 1–2). The psalmist also recognizes the cathartic power of confession, asks God to create within, to act mercifully toward him, and to create within him a clean and pure heart (Ps. 51: 1–10). So, too, it is true with us. Through our remembrance of Jesus' passion on the cross and his victory over the greatest enemy of all, the enemy of death (1 Corinthians 15: 54–57). God renews, reconciles, and restores. A few verses earlier St. Paul writes *'the last enemy*

to be destroyed is death' (1 Corinthians 15: 26).

The biblical use of the word *enemy* fascinates me. Maybe that's why I find myself intrigued by Jesus' words in Matthew's gospel: *'You have heard it said, "You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you"'* (Matthew. 5: 43–44).

There is a lot to this statement. The reader may be wondering where is he going with this enemy stuff? Simply put, for the remainder of the Sundays in Lent, I plan to preach a sermon series on the subject of: *Love Your Enemies*. In my preparation, I have begun to take note of biblical texts that address the enemies of Jesus. I'm particularly interested in how Jesus handles this delicate dilemma. Let me illustrate with an example from the Fourth Gospel, the story of the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus and the unnamed Samaritan woman get to talking. It is a pretty normal though unusual conversation. As the woman wonders, why is Jesus, a Jew, talking to her, a Samaritan? A seven hundred year old rift had caused the two groups to hate each other; and yet before the conversation is over and the day is done, Jesus' words of warmth, his

devoted acts of kindness and compassion transform the estranged enemy (John 4: 1–25). We think politics in America is polarized. In this narrative, the enemy, the Samaritan woman and her community quite remarkably become Jesus followers, community believers, Christ loving faithful people. Is it fascinating how an experience with Jesus very often touches and transforms human lives, resulting in people finding faith, rekindling, hope, and discovering love they never conceived was possible — all because Jesus shows us how to the enemy? More on this story later.

So, over the next few weeks in Lent, I plan to examine the blessings, the challenges and the benefits of loving our enemies. We'll consider Jesus message as well as the method to his madness. And while our lives may not change like the blind man. We will learn how loving our enemies deliver us from our own blindness can change us.

Love your enemies. We never know how God's grace will work in our lives as we seek to do the impossible. And yet God specializes in the impossible!

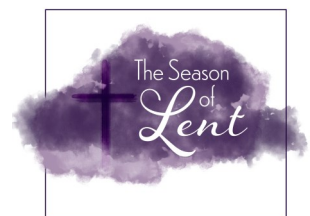

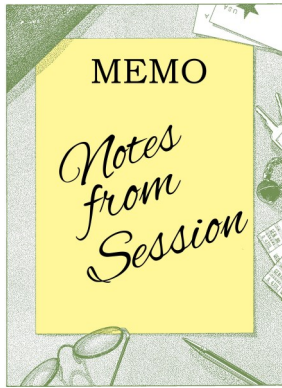

Session News

Session met on Thursday, January 19 and February 23, 2023 and approved the following recommendations and requests:

At the January 19, 2023 meeting:

- Pastor Harvey’s request for vacation on Sunday, February 16, 2023.
- To restart having Ushers and Greeters collect the offering during worship services by passing the plate beginning on March 5, 2023.
- A request from Marlene Wilburn, Director of the Children’s Center, to host a CPR/AED Training, at a cost of \$60 per person, that will be open to church members, date TBD.
- A 6% salary increase for 2023 for church staff.

Food Pantry News

At the January Food Pantry day, the Foodshed Alliance again delivered “winter” vegetables: winter squash,

carrots (all colors), apples, potatoes, and turnips. They have a warehouse in Newton and are able to store vegetables and eggs so that they can deliver all year.

Thirty-four families were served. With the announcement that the Snap (food stamps) benefits are returning to normal allocation (as they were prior to Covid) effective March 1, 2023, we are expecting a significant increase in patrons in March and April.

In February, a lot of the donations for “Soaper Bowl” were on the shelves, when we



closed the doors at 11:30, very little was left. Thank you to everybody who participated! In both January and February, we were overwhelmed with baked goods from Acme and Panera; several boxes were delivered to the Hope Food Pantry.

Again the 4-H Club (Out of Our Shells) had a shelf filled with baked goods “home baked” at the Outreach Center by the members. It is always so nice when we walk in Saturday mornings and the shelf is decorated and filled with goodies. A big “thank you” to the busy bakers!

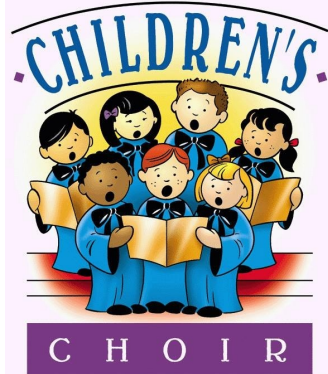

We hope you join us for all or some of these activities.

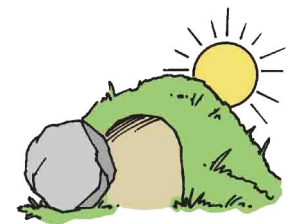

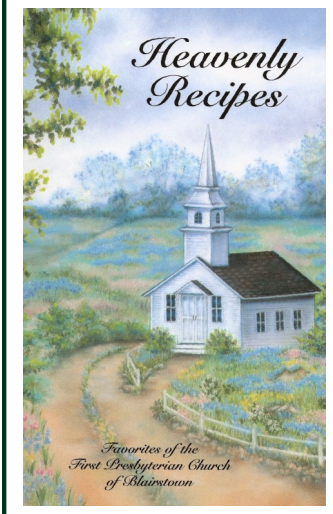

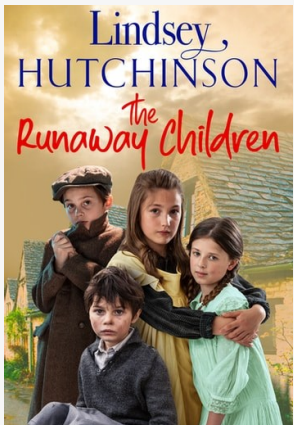

If you're someone who has become inconsistent in your attendance, set a goal to at-

tend more. If you attend church every Sunday, consider taking a more active part by being an usher, greeter, or worship leader. Enjoy the music, listen to God's words, pray, enjoy the company of others and reconnect with God, and perhaps by reconnecting we will truly understand this Bible verse from John 15:5 *I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing* (John 15:5).

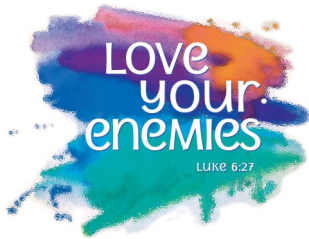
