People: People will come from East and west, and from north and south, and sit at table in the kingdom of God.

Leader: Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers and sisters dwell in unity.

People: God sent the whole world God's only Son. Since God loved us so much, we too, should love one another.

Leader: This is the Lord's table. Our Savior invites all who trust him to share the feast which he

has prepared. Listen to these precious and gracious words of the Lord Jesus:

Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For

my yoke is easy, and my burden is light. Matthew 11: 28–30

Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if those who hear my voice open the door, I will come in to them and eat with them, and they with me.

Amen.

THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION

SHARING THE BREAD: Jesus said, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." (Jn. 6:37) Let us eat this bread in remembrance of Christ and may the spirit that is in him be in us also.

DRINKING THE CUP: Jesus said, "I am the vine, you are the branches, apart from him, we can do nothing." Let us drink this cup in remembrance of Christ and may the spirit in which he died be our Spirit.

#### COMMUNION BLESSING:

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: Awesome God, we give you thanks for the hope we have in Jesus, who died, is risen and reigns over all. Because he lives, we look forward to eternal life, knowing that nothing past, present, or yet to come shall ever separate us from your magnificent, mysterious, and miraculous love made known in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
