## PROCLAIMING GOD'S WORD

**SCRIPTURE:** *Psalm 51: 1–4, 6–14* (Please read responsively) Emily (Maier) Arena

- L: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your loving-kindness; in your great compassion and mercy blot out my transgressions.
- P: Wash me through and through from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.
- L: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.
- P: Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, and so you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment. You desire truth in my inward being; you teach me wisdom in my secret heart.
- L: Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
- P: Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice.
- L: Hide your face from my sins, and wipe away all my guilt.

- P: Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.
- L: Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.

#### INVITATION TO THE OBSERVANCE OF THE LENTEN DISCIPLINE:

Friends in Christ, every year at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes. This ancient sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life and marks the penitence of this community.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of Christ, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of love, and by reading and meditating on the Word of God.

#### PRAYER FOR THE ASHES & LORD'S PRAYER:

- L: Our heavenly Father, in love and mercy you have created us, given life to us, and promised to be with us on the paths that life's journey brings. As we begin our Lenten journey, may this ancient practice of imposing ashes remind us of our human mortality, our personal fragility, and human fallibility, as well as reassure us of the gift of eternity, promised by Jesus himself. This we pray in Christ's name.
- P: Give us grace to accept our human finitude.
- L: Give us faith to face the future with fortitude.
- P: Give us hope to believe in eternal life with certitude.
- All: Give us love that we may love with Jesus' magnitude. This we pray in Jesus' name, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever, who taught us to pray, saying, "Our Father, . . . . Amen."
